Fall 2017 Entering First Year, Full-Time (FYFT) Freshmen

- 1,447 applied, 1,029 accepted, 281 enrolled. Acceptance rate is 71.1%. Yield rate is 27.3%, including 68 men and 213 women.
- Average ACT score: Math 22.4, English 22.7, Reading 23.9, Science 22.9, composite 22.9.
- On average, students rank in the top 30% of their high school class, with an average high school GPA of 3.47.

Fall 2017 Entering Full-Time and Part-Time Transfer Degree-seeking Students

318 applied, 205 accepted, 99 enrolled. Enrolled students include 41 men and 58 women.

Financial Aid

Among the Fall 2016 cohort of full-time, first-time degree-seeking undergraduate students:

- 93.9% received institutional grants, such as scholarships and fellowships funded by Edgewood and individual departments.
- 39.9% received state grants and scholarships.
- 34.2% received federal grants such as Pell Grants and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants.
- 73.8% received student loans.
- The average financial aid package is \$35,300 for first-time full-time freshmen.
