Fall 2018 Entering First Year, Full-Time (FYFT) Freshmen

- 1,560 applied, 1,137 accepted, 255 enrolled. Acceptance rate is 72.9%. Yield rate is 22.4%, including 70 men and 185 women.
- Average ACT score: Math 22.0, English 22.3, Reading 23.2, Science 22.8, composite 22.5.
- On average, students rank in the top 31% of their high school class, with an average high school GPA of 3.4.

Fall 2018 Entering Full-Time and Part-Time Transfer Degree-seeking Students

345 applied, 189 accepted, 91 enrolled. Enrolled students include 23 men and 68 women.

Student Full-Time Equivalent

Financial Aid

Among the Fall 2017 cohort of full-time, first-time degree-seeking undergraduate students:

- 95.7% received institutional grants, such as scholarships and fellowships funded by Edgewood and individual departments.
- 44.1% received state grants and scholarships.
- 29.5% received federal grants such as Pell Grants and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants.
- 71.2% received student loans.
- The average financial aid package is \$38,769 for first-time full-time freshmen.
