

Financial Aid Among the Fall 2019 cohort of full-time, first-time degree-seeking undergraduate students:

- 95.9% received institutional grants, such as scholarships and fellowships funded by Edgewood and individual departments.
- 41.1% received state grants & scholarships.
- 31.1% received federal grants such as Pell Grants and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants.
- 68.9% received student loans.

The average financial aid package is \$41,092 for first-time full-time freshmen.
