Fall 2019 Entering First Year, Full-Time (FYFT) Freshmen

- 1,397 applied, 1,011 accepted, 236 enrolled. Acceptance rate is 72.4%. Yield rate is 23.3%, including 60 men and 176 women.
- Average ACT score: Math 22.1, English 22.4, Reading 23.5, Science 23.1, composite 22.7.
- On average, students rank in the top 31% of their high school class, with an average high school GPA of 3.5.

Fall 2019 Entering Full-Time and Part-Time Transfer Degree-seeking Students

194 applied, 192 accepted, 102 enrolled. Enrolled students include 36 men and 66 women.

Student Full-Time Equivalent

(Full-Time Student = 1, Part-Time Student = 1/3)

Undergraduate: 1,191 + 216/3 = 1,263

Financial Aid

Among the **Fall 2018** cohort of full-time, first-time degree-seeking undergraduate students:

- 96.9% received institutional grants, such as scholarships and fellowships funded by Edgewood and individual departments.
- 44.3% received state grants and scholarships.
- 33.3% received federal grants such as Pell Grants and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants.
- 71.4% received student loans.
- The average financial aid package is \$37,332 for first-time full-time freshmen.
