Fall 2016 Entering First Year, Full-Time (FYFT) Freshmen

- 1,065 applied, 808 accepted, 263 enrolled. Acceptance rate is 75.9%. Yield rate is 32.5%, including 56 men and 207 women.
- Average ACT score: Math 22.2, English 22.7, Reading 23.6, Science 22.9, composite 22.8.
- On average, students rank in the top 32% of their high school class, with an average high school GPA of 3.37.

Fall 2016 Entering Full-Time and Part-Time Transfer Degree-seeking Students

353 applied, 237 accepted, 164 enrolled. Enrolled students include 44 men and 120 women.

Financial Aid

- Among the Fall 2015 cohort of full-time, first-time degree-seeking undergraduate students,
- 93% received institutional grants, such as scholarships and fellowships funded by Edgewood and individual departments.
 - 49.3% received state grants and scholarships.
 - 38.6% received federal grants such as Pell Grants and Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grants.
 - 74.2% received student loans.
 - The average financial aid package is \$33,104 for first-time full-time freshmen.
