




IMPACT REPORT






HENRY J. PREDOLIN FOUNDATION

Henry J. Predolin Foundation's 2022 grant to Edgewood College was a generous \$925,000 for scholarships for approximately 135 students. Recipients included incoming first-year students, upper classmen, and transfer students—all majoring in the areas of Business, Nursing, and Science.

To date, Edgewood College has received more than \$11 million in annual support from Predolin Foundation. In addition to scholarships, Predolin Foundation grant funds have been allocated toward new equipment and capital construction for Business, Nursing, and Science. Since 2008, the total scholarship support received from Predolin Foundation is more than \$7 million and has benefitted more than 500 students.

OSCAR RENNEBOHM FOUNDATION

A multi-year gift of \$300,000 from the Oscar Rennebohm Foundation continues to transform internships for students at Edgewood College. The Inclusive Internship Project—which the Foundation helped to launch in 2019—has now provided over 120 students with support and stipends for what would otherwise be unpaid internship experiences. This has been especially impactful for groups underrepresented in internships. The Project has also fostered partnerships with 90 nonprofit organizations, small businesses, and government agencies, and has developed new relationships with campus programs to further connect students.

Over its 37-year history of support and partnership with Edgewood College, the Oscar Rennebohm Foundation has gifted nearly \$7 million, including for the Center for Healthcare Education & Simulation, the Oscar Rennebohm Library, and the Sonderegger Science Center.

“ I interned with the Wisconsin Women's Business Initiative Corporation. As a nonprofit, they're unable to pay their interns. But thanks to the Inclusive Internship Project, I was able to receive a stipend. Not only that, it also helped me to fine-tune the career path I wanted to take...it prompted me to expand my horizons. 
"You can truly see the magic that is here in this community and the environment which can transform an ordinary kid like me into a student leader and integral member of the Edgewood College community.

THE PAT LUBY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AND ENDOWMENT

Pat Luby was born in 1930 in Ohio to parents who had grade school educations. In the fall of 1948, Pat became the first person in his family to attend College. After earning undergraduate and Ph.D. degrees, he led a successful career as an economist. He served on the Edgewood College Board of Trustees from 1981 – 2004 and remained an active member and friend.

After his passing in 2019, Peg Luby, Pat's wife of 62 years, created The Patrick Luby Memorial Scholarship and Endowment to honor her husband's legacy and to support the needs of first-generation students today and for years to come.
