PROGRAM OVERVIEW

New discounted tuition: courses in the Secondary License Program are now \$668 per credit! The Accelerated Secondary Education Program (ASP) is for individuals interested in teaching students in middle and high schools. ASP offers a license sequence for individuals wanting to teach mathematics, science, social studies, and English. Our program is geared toward:

- Working adults & career changers
- Recent college graduates interested in teaching
- Emergency-Licensed (Tier 1) teachers already working in schools

CULTURALLY RESPONSIVE PRACTICES

Our courses are designed to challenge, explore and foster the development of culturally-responsive teaching practices to educate students in secondary schools. Culturally responsive teaching connects students' cultural knowledge, prior experiences, and performance styles to academic knowledge and intellectual tools in ways that legitimize what students already know. Teachers who complete ASP are individuals who transcend their own cultural biases and preferences to establish and develop patterns for learning and communicating that engage and sustain student participation and achievement.

A LICENSING AND/OR DEGREE FOR WORKING ADULTS

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Applicants must meet all of the requirements for admission to the graduate program.

1. Provide evidence of a baccalaureate or more advanced degree from a United States regionally accredited or equivalent post-secondary institution with a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 on a 4.0 scale for regular admission status. The cumulative grade point average is computed on the highest degree held at the time of application to the Edgewood College graduate program.
2. Complete and submit graduate application (including \$30 fee) to Graduate and Professional Studies Admissions.
Priority Application Deadline – December 1st.
3. Request that official transcripts for all undergraduate and graduate academic credits received from each post-secondary institutions you attended be sent directly to Graduate and Professional Studies Admissions
4. Provide two letters of recommendation from college or university professors, supervisors and/or professional colleagues who can focus on the candidate's probability of success in graduate school.
5. Submit a written statement listing the reasons why you think you will be successful in graduate school; cite how specific background experiences will aid in your success as a student and contribute to your teaching career.
6. Certified background check.
7. Additional entrance exams may be required (as directed by Advisor).
8. International students must contact the School of Graduate and Professional Studies for additional admission requirements.

APPLICATION DEADLINE:

The priority application deadline date is December 1st.

- ED 640 Technology Curriculum Integration: Introductory Teaching Methods
- ED 651B/E/F/H/M/S Curriculum Methods (in your specific content area)
- ED 652A Curriculum Studies: Secondary Literacy
- ED 660A Education Policy and the edTPA (2 credit)
- ED 693B Supervised Field Teaching (2 credits)

MASTER OF ARTS IN EDUCATION DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Candidates who also seek a Master of Arts in Education degree complete the following 3-credit courses (34 credits total):

- ED 603 Introduction to Educational Research (3 cr)
- ED 692 Research Capstone Project (3 cr)
- ED 603 Introduction to Education Research
- ED 692 Research Capstone Project
- 2 additional courses (6 credits) as approved by your advisor
