





Registering for class

- Login to Edgewood Express
- Select the "students" tab on the top left of the page
- Select "Courses and Registration" on the left side of the page
- Click on "Add/Drop Courses"
- Under the drop-down menu for Term, select the appropriate <u>term</u>
- Under the drop-down menu for Division, select "Undergraduate"
- Click "Course search"
- All of the RAAD courses offered in that term will appear. Scroll down until you locate the course you with to take
- Click on the little white square to the immediate left of the course title
- Scroll to the bottom of the page and click "Add course"
- Viola!

Dropping a class

- Login to Edgewood Express
- Select the "students" tab at the top left side of the page
- Select the "Courses and Registration" tab on the left side of the page
- Scroll down to the list of courses you are enrolled in at the bottom of the page
- Check the white box next to the course you wish to drop
- At the bottom of the page, click "Drop course"
- Ta-da!



STUDENT SERVICES



If you have student services needs or questions, a good place to start is always your advisor! He or she can make sure you get connected to the resources you need quickly and smoothly.

<u>Learning Support Services</u>: Where can I get help with homework? There's a whole center devoted to tutoring and learning support services on the Monroe St. campus. Writing Center: The Writing Center, located on the first floor of the library (behind the Printing & Copy Center), offers free, drop-in service to all students. No appointment necessary. Students may bring work from any class, at any stage of development. Tutors offer feedback on all aspects of writing, from organization, evidence, and flow, to citation style and punctuation. We work with students at all levels, in every school and department, and at every level of ability and experience. Students can work off a lap top, or tutors can print out a draft at no cost.

Library: It's hard enough putting together a good research project; finding your sources shouldn't be a nightmare! Whether you're looking for resources, have questions about your project or are just in need of a good book, the library has all sorts of good stuff. You can even have books and media sent out to Deming Way and just return them to the front desk when you're done!
