Exposure and access to Madison's lively arts community along with access to excellent studio facilities and attentive professors expands students' creativity and artwork. The Art faculty at Edgewood College are educators who also engage in active practice as studio artists, designers, and scholars. Each professor brings a personal specialization to the overall program and works one-on-one with students to facilitate their learning through small classes and individual mentoring. The Art Department offers opportunities for interdisciplinary study, field experiences, internships, and study abroad.

Visual and Theatre Arts Center

The Art Department is housed in a new 44,000-square-foot Visual & Theatre Arts Center that is home to:

- Studio space dedicated to graphic design, drawing, painting, mixed media, printmaking, sculpture, ceramics, photography, video, web design, animation and multi-media.
- A specialized laboratory-learning classroom for Art Therapy and Art & Design Teaching programming.
- A skylit atrium ideal for informal gatherings and conversation.
- A professional, well-lit, climate controlled Art Gallery, with additional public spaces for students to exhibit work.

Edgewood College Art Gallery

The Edgewood College Art Gallery is a rich educational and cultural resource for the College community and the Madison area. Works of art in traditional and contemporary media are presented in individual and group exhibitions of local, regional, and internationally recognized artists as well as student and faculty shows. Exhibition openings, gallery talks, lectures, artist workshops, and other events serve as opportunities for dialogue and the exchange of ideas between exhibiting artists, the College community, and the public.

Painted Forest

In 2004, the Kohler Foundation gifted the Painted Forest, located in Valton, Wisconsin, to Edgewood College. The College maintains this important folk art treasure and fosters its role in educating students, artists, researchers and the general public. The Edgewood College Art Studio and Study Center, also located in Valton, provides space for workshops, lectures, retreats, performances and artist residencies.
