

FINANCIAL AID New Freshman AT EDGEWOOD COLLEGE

Academic Scholarships

Students admitted to Edgewood College are automatically considered for the following renewable academic scholarships. No additional application is required. Scholarship level is based on a combination of grade point average and test scores.

Presidential Scholarship (\$48,000; \$12,000 per year) – The average GPA for recipients is a 3.8 with an average ACT of 28.

Dominican Scholarship (\$36,000; \$9,000 per year) – The average GPA for recipients is a 3.7 with an average ACT of 25.

Founders Scholarship (\$24,000; \$6,000 per year) – The average GPA for recipients is a 3.4 with an average ACT of 23.

Heritage Scholarship (\$12,000; \$3,000 per year) – The average GPA for recipients is a 3.0 with an average ACT of 20.

Merit Awards & Talent Scholarships

Students admitted to Edgewood College are invited to apply for additional renewable merit and talent awards. The application will be available December 15 to March 1 at www.edgewood.edu/vip.

MERIT AWARDS

Alumni Award (\$500 – \$1,500) – Awarded to students whose parents or grandparents are Edgewood College alumni.

Bonner Leaders Award (\$2,000) – Awarded to students who have demonstrated a significant commitment to community service and who will continue that commitment at Edgewood College.

Capital City Award (\$1,000 – \$2,000) – Awarded to students who are academically motivated Madison residents or MMSD high school students who demonstrate financial need.

College Access Award (\$1,000 – \$2,000) – Awarded to students who are currently involved in or have successfully completed a comprehensive pre-college program. Examples include but are not limited to: AVID/TOPS, College Possible, Gear Up and Upward Bound.

Community Scholars Award (full-tuition) – Awarded to students who are academically motivated Dane County residents who demonstrate financial need. Students with a strong interest in serving the civic needs of Dane County during college and after graduation are encouraged to apply.

Cor Ad Cor Award (\$500 – \$3,000) – Awarded to students who can make distinctive contributions to Edgewood College either through sharing their demonstrated leadership skills or their unique backgrounds and diverse life experiences.

Mazzuchelli Award (\$500 – \$2,000) – Awarded to students who are actively developing their spiritual life and plan to participate in college ministry opportunities. Students who have a record of noteworthy participation and service within a religious congregation or faith based organization are encouraged to apply.

Predolin Award (\$4,000 – \$6,000) – Awarded to high-achieving students with financial need and an interest in studying science, engineering, medicine, nursing or business.

Voyager Scholarship (\$1,000 – \$4,000) – Awarded to students who live outside Wisconsin.

TALENT SCHOLARSHIPS

Aspiring Writer Scholarship (\$1,000 – \$3,000) – Awarded to students based on a review of their original written works of fiction, poetry or journalism.

Fine Arts Scholarship in Art (\$1,000 – \$3,000) – Awarded to students based on a portfolio review of original work.

Fine Arts Scholarship in Music (\$1,000 – \$3,000) – Awarded to students based on an audition in one of the following areas: voice, woodwind, brass, percussion, piano, orchestral strings, or classical guitar.

Fine Arts Scholarship in Theatre (\$1,000 – \$3,000) – Awarded to students based on a theater audition or technical theatre portfolio review.

World Language Scholarship in Spanish or French (\$1,000 – \$3,000) – Awarded to students who can demonstrate proficiency in Spanish or French.

Need-Based Financial Aid

Students who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) will be considered for the following federal, state and institutional financial aid programs. The FAFSA is available at www.fafsa.gov. The FAFSA priority application deadline is March 1.

Federal Pell Grant – A federal grant that does not have to be repaid.

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) – A federal grant available to students with exceptional financial need. This grant does not need to be repaid.

Wisconsin Tuition Grant – A state grant available to Wisconsin residents who attend a private Wisconsin institution. This grant does not need to be repaid.

Federal Stafford Loan – A low interest loan program. You must repay this loan. Re-payment begins six months after you graduate, leave school, or drop below half-time status. Available in two forms:

Subsidized – awarded based on financial need. The federal government “subsidizes” the interest while you attend school.

Unsubsidized – available to students without financial need. Interest is charged from the time the loan is disbursed until it is paid in full.

Federal Parent Loan of Undergraduate Students (PLUS) – A low interest loan program that allows a parent to fund all or a portion of any remaining balance of their child's educational expenses. This loan must be repaid. A credit check is required.

Edgewood Grant – An institutional grant awarded to students who demonstrate financial need. This grant does not need to be repaid.

Edgewood Employment – This program provides jobs for students allowing them to earn money to help pay educational expenses.
