What can I do to ease my transition to Edgewood College?

Transferring colleges can seem overwhelming. At Edgewood College we do everything we can to help make it a smooth transition. The best way to make the process easier is to keep in contact with the transfer admissions counselor. The counselor will provide you with direction at every step of the process. How can I find out if my credits will transfer to Edgewood College?

We accept credits from regionally accredited colleges and universities, as long as you've earned a C- or better in transferrable credits. We'll provide you with an official evaluation of your transcripts and credits once you've been admitted. How long will it take for me to complete my degree if I transfer to Edgewood College?

The factors involved in determining your time to completion include: how many credits you have completed with a C- or better, how the completed credits fit into the requirements for your major and for the Edgewood College general education requirements, how many credits you plan to take each semester and if you plan to take classes in the summer. The advising staff will work with you to complete your degree in the most efficient way possible.

Am I required to live on campus?

We welcome transfer students to live on campus but you are not required to do so. If you're interested in living on campus, [check out your options](#) and let us know if you have any questions!

Scholarships and Financial Aid?

We offer academic scholarships based on the cumulative GPA of your transfer credits. We will automatically award your academic scholarship which stays with you each year that you are enrolled fulltime. Please note: if your cumulative GPA goes up to a higher level between the time that you apply and the final transcript that you submit, you will receive the higher award. If your GPA goes down, we do not change your original award. Students that plan to submit a FAFSA should add the Edgewood College school code of 003848 as soon as possible so a financial aid package can be completed.

Affordability?

Making college affordable is something that every student and family wants, and it's something we want for you, too. We encourage you to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and apply for transfer scholarships. 99% of transfer students received financial aid in some form last year- whether that be through scholarships, grants or loans. All students receive funds to be able to work on campus as well.
