



CUTTING EDGE PROGRAM COST & FINANCIAL RESOURCES

The **CUTTING EDGE PROGRAM** at Edgewood College was piloted in 2007, making it the first four-year college in Wisconsin to offer a fully inclusive college experience for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Since then, the program has continued to grow and offers individualized wrap-around services to support students in academics, independent living, social experiences, and practicums/internships.

FINANCIAL AID

FEDERAL & STATE GRANTS

Undergraduate students who have not previously earned a bachelor's degree may be considered for awards that do not require repayment.

FEDERAL PELL GRANT *(degree & non-degree seeking)*

A federal need-based grant. Maximum eligibility is for 12 full-time semesters.

FEDERAL SUPPLEMENTAL EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT

(degree & non-degree seeking)

A federal need-based grant. Priority is given to Pell Grant recipients.

WISCONSIN GRANT *(degree seeking)*

A need-based grant for WI residents. Maximum eligibility is for 10 semesters.

VETERANS AFFAIRS BENEFITS *(degree & non-degree seeking)*

EDGEWOOD COLLEGE GRANTS & SCHOLARSHIPS

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS *(degree seeking)*

Presidential, Founders, Heritage, ACCESS or Transfer Scholarships. Awarded to first-time freshmen or new transfer students based on academic achievement.

DEPARTMENTAL & SPECIALTY AWARDS *(degree seeking)*

Awarded based on talent, background, or community involvement.

EDGEWOOD GRANTS *(degree seeking)*

Awarded based on financial need or academic achievement.

CUTTING EDGE SCHOLARSHIPS *(degree & non-degree seeking)*

Awarded annually based on merit and need.

IRIS FUNDING

Students who are eligible for IRIS (Include, Respect, I Self-Direct) may receive funding to be used towards programming costs, but not housing. IRIS is a long-term care option for Wisconsin residents who are eligible for Medicaid.

PAYMENT & LOAN OPTIONS

Regular monthly statements are generated by the 20th of each month and students are notified via their Edgewood College email.

Monthly payments are due by the 15th of the following month. If making monthly payments, there is a flat \$75 enrollment fee per semester.
